6. REPORTS

6.1. Work Group: JPA /EL Dorado County JPA Contract Update

• The work group met for the first-time last week. Meeting went well but not much to report at this time. Good discussion about the direction the negotiations would like to go. Conversation was more about the system they want to design.

6.2. Executive Director Report

- The JPA is getting prepped for the impending storm where there is a blizzard effect warning with major snow and wind. Executive Director Sugiyama contacted the Chiefs and LEMSA to ensure everybody has what is needed and protocols were in place. Medic Unit 49 will be staffing a 9th unit over the weekend if staff are available. EDH Fire is also looking to have a backup medic unit 286 in service as well if they can get staffing. Stretch Fab will be working this weekend to be able to assist if any major mechanical issues that could potentially arise.
- Portable radios have arrived. Andreas and Schuler will be programming those for distribution.
- Executive Director Sugiyama contacted Arrow about two remounts for our medic units. Arrow est. by summertime they will be complete and ready for service.
- Bill has ordered replacement batteries for the LUCAS devices so that medic units can come by the JPA office and get them as needed.
- Executive Director Sugiyama has been in contact with MedPro to try and get a pick up schedule set up and a proper contact for our our account. Contact and communication has been difficult with MedPro, the JPA will continue to work on this issue and look into other companies if needed.
- The APOT summit on 2/13 was a success and very informative. There will be a new standard of 30-minute wall times being implemented soon. The wall times will also need to be at or under that 90% of the time, which presents a challenge for not only this county but Sacramento County as well. Sutter has partnered with the transporting agencies to make the APOT times better and Mercy is also starting to investigate how they can do the same. Metro Fire presented the idea of consolidation and staffing a paramedic at the hospital to take up to 5 patients on the wall. This will be a topic of conversation over the next coming months with this Board and the EMSOC Committee.

MCC just finished an organization wide training "Elevating the Marshall Experience", the mission of this training is to elevate the heart of Marshall and bring up the level of expectations overall.
- 8.9 Mosquito Fire: They are doing a title 22 first aid for their cert group, that is in process. The Mosquito bridge is about 50 % complete, the construction will effect both Mosquito and EDC Fire. A joint plan with County fire for rescues during this construction is being put in place.
